


# HISTORIC FACTS & EVENTS



## ACROSS

- 3 This country passed a law in 2013, dubbed the “gay propaganda law,” that bans any display of LGBTQ support because it would oppose the traditional family values promoted by the government
- 5 Same-sex marriage is only legal in this country on the continent of Africa
- 7 In September of 2018, the Supreme Court of this highly-populated country decriminalized same-sex relationships, reversing the law from 1861
- 8 Jóhanna Sigurðardóttir was this country's first female Prime Minister and the world's first openly LGBTQ head of government
- 10 Much like the New York City Stonewall raids and subsequent uprising, this city had its own clash with police in 1981 sparking a turning point in history for LGBTQ rights

- 1 \_\_\_\_\_ Street Day was the original name of Berlin's pride festival in 1979 to commemorate the Stonewall Riots in NYC
- 2 This city has been voted one of the most gay-friendly cities in the world
- 4 This country became the first in Asia to legalize same-sex marriage in 2019
- 6 A wealthy businessman in this country offered \$65 million to any man that could woo his lesbian daughter into marrying him instead of her longtime female partner
- 9 There are 28 cities in this romantic country that host LGBTQ pride events annually
